### Peer Edit for Introduction

Is there a grabber? Is it effective?

Does the introduction capture the attention of the reader? Do you want to hear more?  
Why or why not?

Does the thesis contain 4 parts?

Author full name

Title

Genre

Main idea/controversial element/ connection to the big picture

Does the thesis contain enough controversy to warrant a 5-6 page paper?

What type of information is contained in the introduction? Does it all relate to the thesis?  
Is the information relevant? For example, it should contain very little (or nothing) about  
the author.

Are the three main points stated succinctly and clearly?

Does the intro contain quotes? If so, are they handled properly?  
(integration/mechanics/citation)

### Peer Edit for Main Points

Topic sentence is first, delineating what is being proven in the paragraph.

Closing sentence reflects subject of topic sentence.

Minimum of 2 quotes (1 from primary, 1 from secondary)

The paragraph proves the point as stated in topic sentence.

The main point is 1-1 1/3 pages long.

Look for smoothness and style.

Does the writing flow? Mark suggestions for improvement in punctuation/grammar, etc.
